QUESTIONS FREQUENTLY ASKED BY RESPONDENTS

What is this survey all about? This survey - called the Quarterly Labor Force Survey - is undertaken every quarter to provide up-to-date information on labor force and its characteristics. It is geared principally towards the estimation of the level of employment, unemployment and underemployment of the country. Occasionally, this survey is conducted together with other surveys to gather additional information on income and expenditure, housing, family operated activities, food and energy consumption, education, mass media and social mobility, community facilities and community participation, vital statistics such as births, deaths and migration, and other important subjects.

What benefit do I get from giving information? A continuing supply of data on labor force is needed by the government to serve as basis for the formulation of policies and plans to direct programs which will pave the way for the creation and generation of gainful employment and livelihood opportunities, reduction of unemployment, promotion of employment, improvement of working conditions and enhancement of the welfare of a working man, and so on. The data gathered are also useful to private concerns and other end users in decision-making and planning activities for the studies or projects they wish to undertake.

How was I selected for this survey? Actually, your household rather than you personally was selected for this survey to represent hundreds of other households in the barangay. There are about 20,000 households nationwide selected scientifically for the survey.

How many times will I be visited? As a sample household, you will be visited at most 4 times a year. Every quarter, one fourth of the sample households are replaced by new sample households.

I hesitate to tell some things about the members of my household. What protection do I have? All information supplied by individuals to this office is held in strictest confidence by law (Commonwealth Act No. 591, Section 4) and hence, cannot be used for purposes of taxation, investigation or enforcement procedure, nor will it be published except in the form of statistical summaries in which no reference to an individual, corporation, association, partnership, institution or business enterprise shall appear. Any person who discloses such information shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine or a jail penalty.

Is this survey authorized by Law? Yes. Commonwealth Act No. 591 authorized this office to collect by enumeration, sampling or other methods, statistics and other information concerning population, agricultural conditions, employment and other subjects.
